Zoo Crew CIT Volunteer Position Description

POSITION TITLE: Zoo Crew Counselor in Training (CIT)
CLASSIFICATION: Volunteer Department: Education
REPORTS TO: ZooCamp Director, ZooCamp Counselors

DUES: \$30 annual fee to cover ID badge, t-shirt, and appreciation events

COMMITMENT: 4 weeks of summer ZooCamp, plus one week of either Winter (2/19-2/23) or Spring

(4/15-4/19) ZooCamp as a second stage interview (if unavailable for both Winter and Spring Camp, see "ZooCamp Availability" page for information about a possible third option during 2023 Fall

Zoo-Cation Day Camps).

Summary of Responsibilities:

CITs are teen volunteers within our Zoo Crew program. CITs will assist in the ZooCamp experience and help maintain a safe, fun environment for campers (ages 4-10) by encouraging participation, modeling ZooCamp expectations, and assisting campers with skills during activities or crafts; CITs will be supervised by ZooCamp staff while a part of the ZooCamp team and will gain extensive experience in the organization of camp programs, teamwork, leadership, public speaking, and classroom management.

Essential Position Functions:

- 1. Greet ZooCampers and families, assist campers in finding and using their cubbies and in acclimating to the ZooCamp environment and encourage campers to participate in morning games and daily camp activities.
- 2. Model ZooCamp expectations for campers to encourage safe and respectful behavior.
- 3. Help foster a love of nature and learning in campers by maintaining an enthusiastic, positive attitude.
- 4. Help create and maintain a safe, welcoming, fun environment for ZooCampers, utilizing tools such as songs and group games when appropriate.
- 5. Facilitate a variety of Play Pod activities for campers during the lunch period.
- 6. Assist ZooCamp staff in maintaining camper safety while out on Zoo grounds, such as during a Zoo tour, and remain with campers and ZooCamp staff during the day.
- 7. Be present for both AM and PM meetings and occasional team-building events on evenings or weekends.
- 8. Help ensure camp runs smoothly and efficiently by assisting with any related tasks, administrative or otherwise, as directed by ZooCamp Counselors, Jr. Counselors, Assistant ZooCamp Director or ZooCamp Director.

Qualifications:

- 1. Must be a student in the 7th-12th grade. Grade verification may be required.
 - a. If the teen's 18th birthday falls during the summer season (6/17-8/23) the applicant or current CIT will not be able to commit to that season, as they will not be able to volunteer for a full summer.
 - b. If accepted and once they are a part of the CIT program, teens will age out of the program on their 18th birthday.
- 2. Commit to at least four full weeks of summer ZooCamp, Monday-Friday, 8:00am-4:30pm (5:00pm on Fridays).
- 3. Must commit to volunteering during either Winter Camp (2/19-2/23) or Spring Camp (4/15-4/19) as a second stage interview. If you are unavailable for both Winter and Spring Camp, see "ZooCamp Availability" page for information about a possible third option during 2023 Fall Zoo-Cation Day Camps.
- 4. Must commit to four mandatory trainings on Wednesday, May 22nd, 5:30 pm 7:30 pm (parent attendance required), Wednesday, May 29th 5:00-7:00 PM, Sunday, June 9th, 1 pm 5:30 pm, Wednesday, June 12^h, 4:30 pm 7:30 pm, and one TBD.
- 5. Arrive on time and stay for the entire volunteer shift, with reliable transportation to and from the Zoo.
- 6. Ability to move throughout the Zoo and be outside for the majority of time volunteering.
- 7. Enjoy engaging and interacting with children of all ages.
- 8. Interest in conservation and the natural world.
- 9. Ability to operate well in a team environment, as well as independently.
- 10. Effectively support the mission and priorities of Roger Williams Park Zoo.
- 11. Adhere to all policies described in the Roger Williams Park Zoo's Volunteer Handbook.
- 12. Must be flexible and willing to learn.

preliminary interview rounds, he/she will be required to commit to a second stage interview (see previous page for dates). If selected for the CIT program following the interview process, he/she will be required to volunteer for four weeks of Summer ZooCamp.
I understand that if my child is accepted as a CIT, he/she will be engaging and interacting with children ages $4-10$. He/she will always be supervised by Zoo staff and will receive informal and formal feedback weekly.
I also understand that if my child is accepted as a CIT, he/she will be offered team building and field trip opportunities outside of the regular ZooCamp day. I allow my child to participate in these opportunities unless otherwise communicated to the ZooCamp Director.
My child has or I will provide reliable and on-time transportation to and from each day of camp. I will also make every effort to not schedule appointments/activities during camp hours. I understand that RWPZ ZooCamp relies heavily on assistance from CITs and their tardiness or absence may affect the quality of zoo campers' experiences.
If my child is selected for a CIT position at Roger Williams Park ZooCamp, I agree to complete a confidential medical information form for my child and to return this form to the ZooCamp Director prior to my child beginning as a CIT.
