### **Instructor Responsibilities:**

- Facilitate:
  - afterschool programs at other sites.
  - o school programs both on and off Zoo grounds.
  - o community outreach programs both on and off grounds to a variety of audiences including, but not limited to, scout groups, camp groups, home school groups, and other community organizations.
  - o a variety of family programs including, but not limited to, Breakfast with the Animals, Insider Tours, and Wild Connections encounters.

- o at least one Snore and Roar Overnight program per week (Friday and Saturday nights, 5 pm-10 pm February June and September November).
- Provide support for Winter, Spring, Holiday, and Summer ZooCamp in a variety of capacities including, but not limited to, acting as a ZooCamp counselor, facilitating aftercare and/or animal encounters, as needed.
- Driving Zoo motor vehicles to programs and operating the motor vehicle in a safe manner.

# **Curriculum Responsibilities**

 Work with Manager of School Programs and School Program Specialists to plan afterschool programming.

# **Animal Handling Presentation Responsibilities**

- Be proficient in all aspects of the presentation of Ambassador Animals as gleaned through the completion of RWPZ Ambassador Animal training components.
- Transport animal carriers and program supplies to and from vehicles and throughout the Zoo.

# Other functions and responsibilities (Non-Essential/Marginal Functions)

• Support both the mission of the Zoo and the related mission of the Education Department by performing other duties as assigned by the Education Managers and/or the Director of Education.

# Required Experience, Training, and/or Education

*Required Experience and Education:* 

We will consider various combinations of relevant experience and education providing they meet the minimum requirements of demonstrating the following:

- experience in non-formal science and conservation education program facilitation
- an understanding of educational pedagogy, lesson design, learning psychology, and child development
- an understanding of key areas of work including, special education, informal learning, outdoor education, science education, or developmental psychology.

- Previous customer service experience, particularly in a zoo or aquarium setting.
- Experience working with diverse populations and fluency in speaking additional languages.
- Experience and comfort handling animals weighing up to 15 pounds in a Zoo or Aquarium setting.
- certification in CPR and First Aid Training.
- Recent experience working with diverse populations and fluency speaking additional languages.

  - o work with children and adults of all ages and learning abilities.

- o identify and respond to signs of stress in a variety of animals including mammals, reptiles, amphibians, invertebrates, and various types of birds, including but not limited to raptors, macaws, waterfowl, and galliforms.
- o function in a professional environment, demonstrating responsibility, creative problem-solving
- maintain effective working relationships.
- o facilitate programs independently and with co-facilitators.
- o listen actively and always respond in a respectful tone.
- o build trust through regular open and honest communication.
- create a work environment of inclusiveness, welcoming others' suggestions and points of view.
- o establish priorities, manage time, and organize resources effectively.
- o meet deadlines.
- o work safely and follow established safety standards.
- o manage time to plan and implement programs.
- o quickly and thoughtfully respond to animal, animal-related human, and human health emergencies.
- Must demonstrate proficiency working with:
  - a variety of animals including mammals, reptiles, amphibians, invertebrates, and various types
    of birds.
  - o animals while simultaneously engaging with the public.
  - o speaking in front of large groups of people.
  - Microsoft Office (primarily Excel, Word & Outlook).

- o high level of patience.
- classroom management and behavior management skills.
- o strong communication skills; verbal and written.

### **Additional Requirements**

- Successful completion of a background check.
- Valid driver's license.
- Availability to work weekends, evenings, and holidays (up to 28 hours per week, however, hours may not be available every week).
- Be comfortable working outdoors and in adverse conditions (heat, rain, cold, etc.).
- Occasional travel via all modes of transportation.
- Frequently requires handling moving animals, which may weigh up to 15 pounds for 30-minute intervals.
- Frequently lifts and/or moves stationery items such as animal carriers up to 30 pounds for 30-minute intervals.
- Comfortable in loud, high-energy environments.
