



Conservation Heroes ZooCamp Counselor Job Posting

RWPZ is currently recruiting a full-time, seasonal, exempt, ZooCamp Conservation Heroes Counselor. ZooCamp Conservation Heroes Counselor is responsible for assisting the Lead Conservation Heroes ZooCamp Counselor as they empower campers ages 11-14 to become leaders in conservation through teambuilding and leadership activities, engagement in inquiry activities, games, encounters with wild animal ambassadors, visits to animal exhibits and outdoor exploration.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Work effectively with Lead Conservation Heroes ZooCamp Counselor to captivate and engage campers in a curriculum that includes inquiry-based activities, teambuilding, animal encounters, and Zoo tours.
- Ensure the safety of all ZooCampers while participating in ZooCamp - will require enforcing policies and responding to emergency situations and administering first aid as needed.
- In the event of the Lead Conservation Heroes Counselor's absence, oversee the Conservation Heroes camp day and provide supervision & support to a substitute co-counselor.
- Set and maintain behavioral expectations for campers.
- Utilize a variety of behavioral support tools, when applicable, to ensure a fun, safe and inclusive environment for campers of all abilities.
- Work with Inclusion Specialist to facilitate the inclusion of campers of all abilities into Conservation Heroes ZooCamp.
- Build and maintain a good rapport with campers and parents.

- Coordinate with Assistant ZooCamp Administrators to assist in creating and sending daily e-mail newsletters to Conservation Heroes parents. This will include photo documenting the day and ensuring the photos are received daily by the Assistant Administrators at pre-identified times.
- Actively participate in and occasionally take a leadership role in teambuilding, trainings, and daily ZooCamp team meetings.
- Maintain open and clear communication with the ZooCamp team, including the ZooCamp Administration Team – the ZooCamp Administrator, Assistant ZooCamp Administrators and Inclusion Specialist, and Manager of Family Programs.
- Communicate effectively with members of other Zoo departments.
- Assist with the daily clean-up and continual organization of the Conservation Heroes classroom and assist with clean-up and organization of ZooCamp when needed.
- Oversee supply inventory and maintenance of Conservation Heroes supplies.
- Demonstrate and encourage respect of Zoo exhibit animals & animal ambassadors during Zoo tours & animal encounters.
- Assist with initial and continual camp curriculum development, seeking opportunities to enhance the camp experience.

Other functions and responsibilities (Non-Essential/Marginal Functions)

Support both the mission of the Zoo and the related mission of the education department by performing other duties as assigned by the ZooCamp Administrator, Assistant ZooCamp Administrators, Manager of Family Programs, and/or the Director of Education.

Required Experience, Training and/or Education:

Required Experience and Education:

We will consider a various combination of relevant experience and education providing they meet the minimum requirements. The minimum requirements for this position consider a combination of education and work experience that demonstrate the following:

- Non-formal science, environmental education, camp and/or conservation education program facilitation
- Experience with team leadership.
- One year program facilitation with children ages 11-14
- Managing program participant safety

Preferred Experience and Education:

The following experience, training and/ or education would be valued in a candidate:

- Experience working with children of varying abilities, including those with autism spectrum disorder is preferred.
- Experience mentoring teens
- Familiarity with informal education and summer camp environment
- Recent experience working with a diverse population and fluency in speaking additional languages

Competencies:

Ability to effectively:

- make quick, responsible decisions and improvise when needed.
- work independently and as a member of a team.
- engage children of varying abilities (primarily ages 11-14 years of age) in facilitated experiences.
- adapt to a dynamic work environment which may include schedule changes, coverage for other groups, and alterations to daily activities.

- function in a professional environment, demonstrating responsibility, and creative problem solving.
- maintain working relationships, through open communication and trust that fosters both giving, receiving, and applying feedback.
- facilitate programs independently and with a co-counselor.
- listen actively and respond in a respectful tone.
- create a work and program environment that is inclusive, welcoming other's suggestions and points of view.
- establish priorities, manage time, and organize resources.
- follow and enforce established safety standards.

Must Possess:

- an appreciation for informal, lifelong learning in agreement with Roger Williams Park Zoo's mission and commitment to education and conservation.
- effective classroom and behavior management skills and adaptability to new strategies.
- strong communication skills; written and verbal.
- communication skills that are open, thorough, respectful, and clear with campers, parents, volunteers, and other staff.

Additional Requirements

- At least 18 years of age (necessitated by supervision of teen volunteers ages 12-17).
- Ability to work outdoors under various weather conditions.
- Successful completion of a background check.
- Valid driver's license.
- Flexibility to work occasional evenings & weekends.
- Must be willing to become first aid/ CPR certified and maintain certification.
- Work environment is split between indoor classroom spaces with moderate to loud noises and outdoors in various weather conditions with similar noise levels.

Supervisory Responsibilities:

Assisting in supervising teen volunteers.
